DolceVita is a SugarCRM CE 5.1.0 **Virtual Appliance** which runs on:

- VMware
- Vmware ESX
- Citrix XenServer
- Virtual Iron
- Microsoft Hyper-V / VirtualPC
- **Amazon EC2**

The appliance was developed by [Openliven](#) using the [rBuilder](#) platform from [rPath](#).

This user guide refers to the **1.1 Beta version** and explains how to deploy the appliance on **Amazon EC2 (Amazon Elastic Compute Cloud)**.

This guide takes you through the following steps:

- 📁👉 account registration on Amazon EC2 (briefly)
- 📄👉 installation of Elasticfox (briefly)
- 📄👉 start/stop on SugarCRM (dolcevita) on Amazon EC2

Registration on Amazon EC2

You can find all kind of info on EC2 in this Amazon [page](#). In case you do not have an account yet, simple follow the “Sign up for Amazon EC2” link and after few single steps an account will be set up for you.

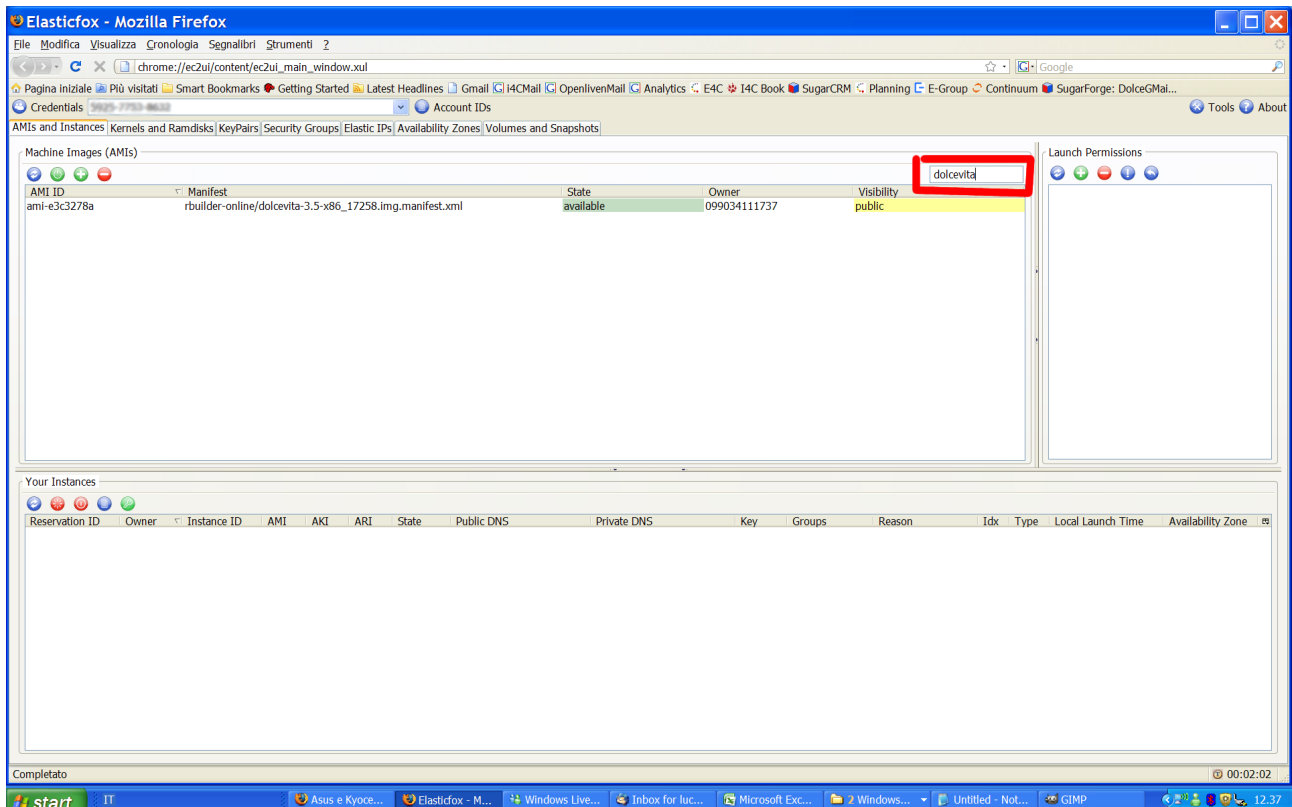
Installation of Elasticfox

Elasticfox is a Firefox (1.5.0 or later) Add-on used for controlling your appliances on Amazon EC2

- Download and run Elasticfox from [Amazon](#)
- Follow the [documentation](#) of Elasticfox to configure it for you EC2 account

Run DolceVita on Amazon EC2

Run Elasticfox under Firefox (Tools->Elasticfox) and look for 'dolcevita' as you can see in the following screenshot:



The AMI list is now filtered and you can see the DolceVita Appliance ready to be started

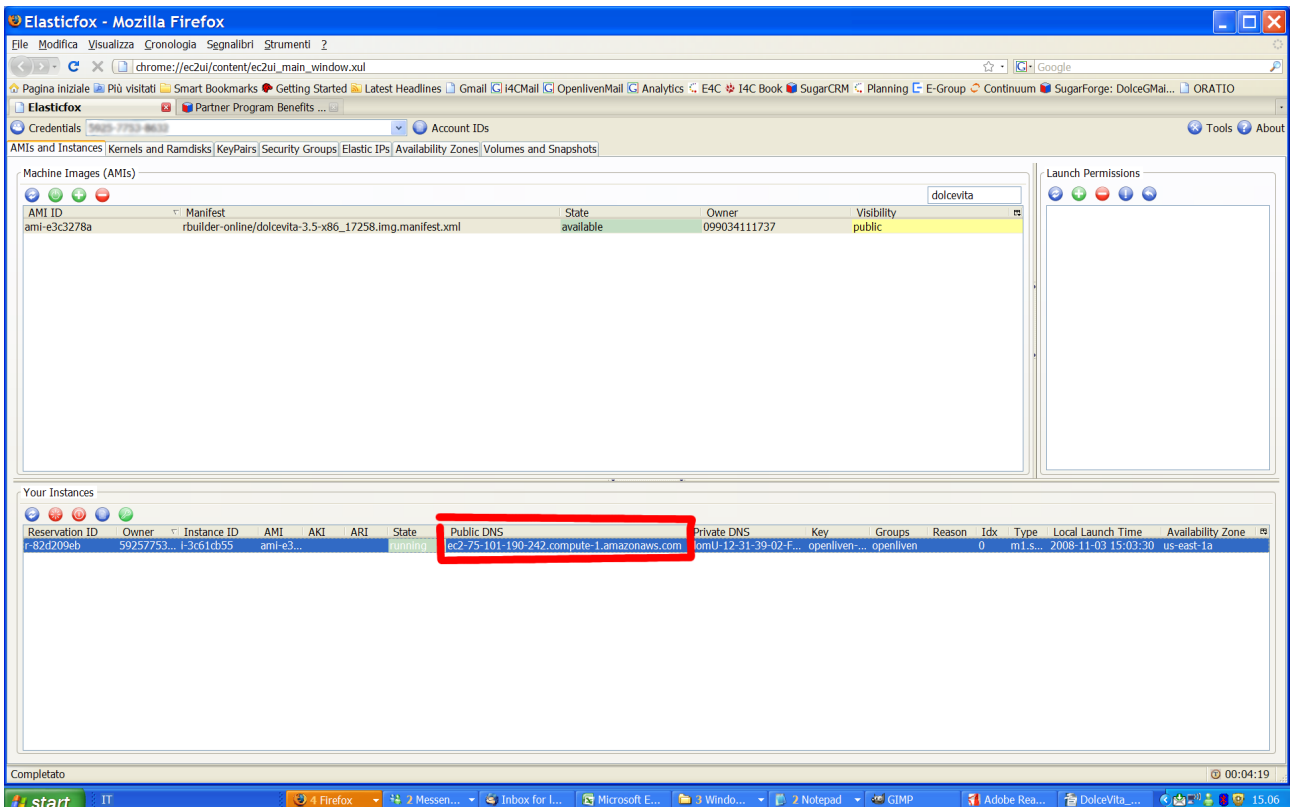
Next go to the Security Groups tab in order to enable ports on the machine you are about to start: follow the paragraph “Setting up a Security Group” from the [documentation](#) and enable port 80 (http), 22 (ssh), 8003 (rPath rAPA)

Then move back to the AMIs tab and launch the appliance:

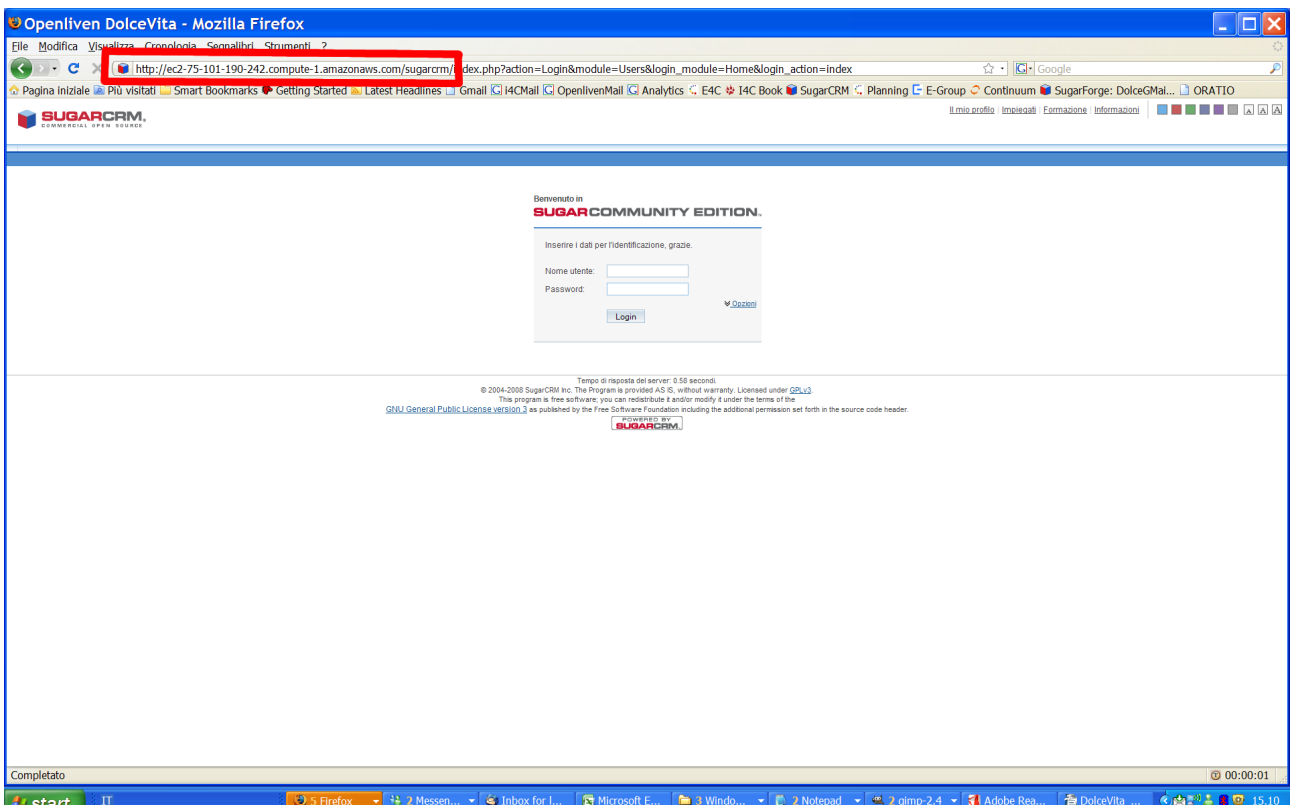
- right click on the appliance and select “Launch instance(s) of this AMI
- select one of your keypairs (you should have configured one during the Elasticfox setup (see the [documentation](#) at “Setting up Elasticfox”)
- choose the Security Group you created in the previous step
- press Launch

Now you should see the following on the bottom section of Elasticfox (sometime you need to press the Refresh button):

Follow the use steps you can find in the DolceVita README to change the root password and ssh to the appliance.



The Public DNS field represents the Url where you can reach your SugarCRM instance (add /sugarcrm at the end) as depicted below:
